
ENTERPRISE NETWORK USING CISCO PACKET TRACER

DESIGN TOPOLOGY: STAR TOPOLOGY

Alternatively referred to as a star network, star topology is one of the most common network setups. Every node connects to a central network device in this configuration, like a hub, switch, or computer. The central network device acts as a server, and the peripheral devices act as clients. In a star topology setup, either a coaxial or RJ45 network cable is used, depending on each computer's type of network card. The image shows how this network setup gets its name, as it is shaped like a star.



ADDRESSING MODE: IP ADDRESSING

IP address is an address having information about how to reach a specific host, especially outside the LAN. An IP address is a 32-bit unique address having an address space of 232. Generally, there are two notations in which IP address is written, dotted decimal notation and hexadecimal notation.

Classful Addressing The 32 bit IP address is divided into five sub-classes.

These are: • Class A • Class B • Class C • Class D • Class E
